5. Mission giving and donations

The PCC set aside 5% of unrestricted income each month into an Outward Giving fund. In 2019 this equated to £2,672 (5% of 53,432). In addition, £818 was carried forward from 2018.

A regular payment of £50 per months is given to support the work of Sarah Paine and Atulya. We also started a second regular payment of £50 a month to Claude and Ruth Baraberewe, who are Iris Global Mission Partners, working in Burundi. They visited Amington during 2019, during which time their son Caleb was born.

Giving to charities is decided by ballot when the Outward Giving fund reaches £1,000. The PCC chooses three charities; every person who attends a service may put a token in the ballot box for their preferred charity – at the end of the month the £1,000 is split in proportion to the votes cast.

Therefore we ended the year with £208 to carry over into 2020. The PCC intends to continue to set aside 5% of unrestricted income throughout 2020 – with the ultimate aim that when we can afford to pay a full Common Fund, our Outward Giving can increase to 10%.

6. Special Projects and Peter Edridge's legacy

In 2017 we were left a legacy, which was finally paid to us in 2019 – £10,749. The PCC decided to designate the gift into the Special Projects fund, which was started in 2018 with another donation.

The PCC decided to give 5% (£540) of the gift as an additional Common Fund payment, and 5% of the gift into the church's hardship fund. £554 was paid into the reserves, leaving £9,116 to spend.

This leaves £4,736 to be carried forward in the Special Projects fund. Most of that has already been earmarked for replacing the shed and levelling the churchyard.

Also during 2019 the Special Projects fund was used to refurbish the toilet, which badly needed to be done, and was possible after the installation of the kitchenette – this cost a total of £2,090.

7. Kitchenette

At the end of 2018 we started to raise funds to put a kitchenette at the back of church. In total we raised £5,423 which meant we only needed an additional £510 from the Special Projects fund, as the total cost was £5,933. (Given the budget was £6,333 this was an excellent result all round!)

The difference made by the kitchenette is huge, both on Sunday mornings and for special events – and it was made possible entirely by the generous donations of church members.

8. Reserves Policy

It is PCC policy to try to maintain a balance on unrestricted funds which equates to at least three months' unrestricted payments. This is equivalent to approximately £12,000. It is held to smooth out fluctuations in cash flow and to meet emergencies. The cash balance of £12,036 held on unrestricted funds at the year-end is slightly above this level – leaving us with a small 'surplus' of £36 for the year.

It is also PCC policy that if we end the year with a surplus above our level of reserves, we will give half of that to the diocesan Common Fund. However, given the small size of the surplus this year, it seemed unnecessary to make a one-off donation of £18.
